Major Garage Repair Project Update

Exterior visitor parking area:

- Curb cut back at the top of the ramp to allow for more traffic visibility entering and exiting the ramp. Landscaping in this area will be completed shortly.
- Repairs to area drains complete along with asphalt and line painting.

Essex II:

 Leak into the P2 level from the P1 level outside of the billiard room repaired. New slabs installed. Final sealing will be applied to bring out the colour of the stone to match the existing.

Underground Garage:

- The replacement of the worn out compression seals with new longer lasting materials at the base of the inside walls of our underground garage, complete.
- Membrane repairs underway in various parking spots and surrounding drains in the drive lanes. An extra day for the membrane application was required versus plan, putting us behind schedule by

approximately 2 weeks.

- Major work on the membrane coatings on the P1 level drive lanes, pillar bases and both the north and south turning areas are underway, with completion of all work expected by mid-June.
- This phase is particularly challenging to us all. Please be patient as we navigate in and out around the barriers.
- Take heart! It will be over soon and we should not have to repeat this for some years to come.

The Invisible Water Bill

Even though Essex residents don't receive a monthly water bill, it doesn't mean we aren't paying for our water use. Part of our monthly fees goes toward this utility.

In the interest of keeping future costs down and just being responsible citizens of the 21st century, here are some water saving practices that any condo resident can do:

- Install efficient showerheads and faucet aerators.
- Resist running water continuously while shaving, shampooing or brushing.
- Shorten showers and fill tubs only part way.
- Keep faucets, taps and toilets in good repair.
- Keep drinking water in the fridge to avoid running taps.

Interesting facts:

- Showerheads use up to 1/3 of all the hot water in a home.
- Dripping faucets at one drop per second waste over 2,000 gallons of water per year.
- Canadians waste twice as much water as European consumers.
- It takes more water to hand wash dishes than to run a full dishwasher.

Six Points Park

Six Points Park (to the east of Essex 1) is city-owned with usage governed under rules set by the City of Toronto. For example, without a permit, no person is to enter or gather

in this park between the hours of 12:01 am and 5:30 am. The Essex has no duty or authority to enforce rules of behaviour in this park.

For the convenience of residents of The Essex, a set of

park rules, considered applicable to Six Points Park is available at <u>theessex.ca/about</u>.

If you see any unsafe behaviour in the park, call the police at 911 or notify Essex security, who will verify the situation and call on your behalf.

You are advised to never intervene yourself. City officials advise that there is no bylaw prohibiting "safe" skateboarding in city parks, however they promise that skateboarding deterrents are being manufactured and will be installed soon.

Park signage is also on the way.

We are assured that City Park's staff are verifying which park trees and shrubs are indeed dead.

When they are convinced, they promise to replace them.
